ReportsReport

Dr. Isoye reported on 1) the great start to the beginning of the year and the vibrancy of the building when all of the students, faculty and staff return; 2) 140 students volunteered to train as mentors to the 817 freshmen students during the summer and they greeted them on the August 17 Huskie Kickoff day; 3) 19 students went to the prestigious Global Student Leaders conference in Davos, Switzerland, this summer and 2 OPRF students, out of the 1,500 who participated, were among the 24 award winners for video projects they had created for the conference. OPRF senior Nick Drain focused on making computer coding as commonly taught as keyboarding, noting that in the next five years, a million coding jobs will go unfilled due to lack of skill. OPRF junior Annabelle Huber made her video on acceptance and open-mindedness; 4) Cast members Max Gonzalez and Andrew Krueger and production crew members Isobel Duncan, Gabriel Girson, and Jeremy Pesigan will attend the Theatre Festival in January at Illinois State University; 5) The new Huskie Spirit Club was started by seniors Will Zimbler, Alex Ivanov, and Cal Connolly, and their goal is to build a groundswell of school spirit; thus far, more than 600 students have joined the club's Facebook page. They will plan themes for every home football game and other winter and spring sports.

Reports/discussions/updates were presented on 1) changing the 2016 graduation day from Sunday to Thursday; 2) the pool and possible referendum; 3) an audit of the reading program; 4) Strategic Plan Operation Committee; 5) the Pacific Education Group contract; 6) Student Discipline; 7) Student Participation and Extracurricular Activities; and 8) the Student Growth Workgroup. In addition, Faculty Senate appreciated the work the Board of Education had done over the summer in order to have been able to adopt its goals for this school year and that it supported the reading program. The Board of Education welcomed new Student Council Board Liaison representative Hattie Grimm who then reported that Homecoming and charity work were Student Council's main focus at this time.
