RE: 2014-2015 Board Goals

#### **Background and Information**

On Tuesday, May 27, the Board of Education had a special board meeting to discuss governance and begin formulating the 2014-2015 board goals. Towards the end of the session, Board members were asked to list their high priority areas for the district. We were then charged with using this list to formulate goals for 2014-2015. Our facilitator, Jeff Cohn, recommended that the superintendent align the priorities with the strategic plan, and this information will inform the Board of a possible direction for goal setting. Attached in Appendix A is the spreadsheet of ideas and how they fit with the strategic plan. The Goals were identified along with specific action steps that align with the priority item.

In addition to the spreadsheet, you will find in Appendix B, the actual goal statement and action for the areas that were most frequent in based on this work. Further analysis indicates that there a trend in regards to the direction of specific action statements. Three of the five indicate relationships as a theme. This larger direction could be a unifying piece to moving the strategic plan forward. Though these are the goals of the Board and set direction for the district, I am asking the Board to consider action items focused around a relationship theme rather than acting as separate entities. The Board may consider any or all of the goals presented in Appendix C.
