Student Showcase:



Girls' Flag Football Team – Jim Geovanes, Director of Intramurals, discussed the Girls' Flag Football Team. In conjunction with NFL Flag and Nike, the Chicago Bears initiated a flag football team which currently includes 66 Chicago and suburban teams (OPRFHS is the first suburban school to have a team). Other teams in the West Suburban Conference are Willowbrook, Morton East/West, and Proviso East/West. Coaches Jean "Tank" Corner and Phylicia Nash introduced five girls from the Flag Football Team: Saniya Shotwell, Cydney McDonald, Kelly Reagan, Shardae Spruille, Tyler Brock, and Teshell O'Neal – who will be playing Willowbrook this weekend (both teams are currently 2-0).



ASPIRA (Latin Leadership Club) – Stephanie Oliver, Club Sponsor, introduced student Anabel Govea, who discussed some of the things that the ASPIRA club is planning for current and future activities, such as – creating a banner for Homecoming that will be written in Spanish, hosting a potluck, inviting a Mariachi Band to perform at the high school, and introducing the Hispanic culture to the entire school. Annabelle is grateful for the music played in the hallways to celebrate Hispanic Heritage Month. Annabelle ended that the ASPIRA Club is not only for students of Spanish descent but for every student who would like to explore and get informed about the culture.

Student Council Liaison Report

Student Council Liaison, Jacob Drews, discussed the following:

- **Homecoming**: There have been 100 students per week preparing for Homecoming (the week of September 26). Approximately 1,400 tickets have been sold for the Homecoming dance, to be held on October 1 in the Field House. This year's theme is OPRF MET Gala.
- **Students Concerns:** Some of the students' concerns discussed were:
 - Bell schedules: Students have felt there has been quite a bit of confusion with the bell schedules. Some classrooms will have the bell schedules posted; some do not. Students understand that with the new bell schedules, there is an adjustment period.
 - Advisory: Students like advisory for the "community" feeling they received during this time and missed having advisory every day (except for late arrival Wednesday). Although the students like the weekly late arrival Wednesdays, students do miss advisory on Mondays and Fridays and would like to see this return.

- Junior Gabe Ford is currently training for the 2023 Boxing Golden Gloves tournament and, as a part of his journey, has launched a \$20,000 fundraising campaign for the Austin Boxing Club and two other local nonprofits with missions to end gun violence.
- Led by Sensei Yoko Schmadeke, the Japanese program was awarded a Japanese Chamber of Commerce and Industry of Chicago (JCCC) Foundation grant of \$3,000 to fund this year's Japan Fest. This will be the first year since the start of the pandemic that Japan Fest will be held.
- The OPRFHS Marching Band placed third in Class AA at the Amos Alonzo Stagg Marching Jamboree.

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- Congratulations to math teachers Christine Mondragon and Jaime Burbano, who are featured in the Lathisms Hispanic Heritage Month calendar! Between Sept. 15 and Oct. 15, Lathisms is featuring a prominent Latinx/Hispanic mathematician daily.
